Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

Achieved Youth Sports Trust Award – Gold Lordswood achieved Bronze, in the Medway Primary Schools Sport Award. Strong positive community links have been made (extracurricular club - football for girls) All children are participating in an engaging Curriculum and the development of skills. More competitive opportunities with the Trust schools. Swimming Top up sessions for Year 5 completed to ensure that the children meet the NC requirements (Term 1 & 2). Participated in the GSF competition and won top Primary school within the Trust. Held Lordswood Olympics and Challenge 26 fun run – engaged the parents to compete against their children in a variety of sports and raise money for the school and SportEd UK. Sports ministry roles have been developed well and pupil voice informs decisions – Children in Need and presenting to parents during Open Afternoon. More children in KS1 active outside of the Curriculum due to installation of outside gym equipment. Sports after school provision has run throughout the year – engaging more children outside of school time. Enrichment activities within the school day has given children who are unable to attend after school provision, access to new sports.
