What is Art?

Art is something that is created with imagination and skill and expresses important ideas or feelings.

Why do we teach Art?

Art is an opportunity for making choices, coming to conclusions, second-guessing decisions, and evaluating results.

Art helps children become more comfortable with uncertainty and remain flexible thinkers.

Art is important for its own sake—as a source of beauty and expression, as well as simply for the process of creating.

Art is *fun*, an activity they enjoy.



How do we teach Art?

Our Art curriculum allows every child to experience a diverse range of Arts.

We engage children in interesting topics and expose them to the work of influential artists from all backgrounds, genders and walks of life, to ensure that all children view themselves as artists and understand that they are able to make choices about their own artwork.

We provide visual, tactile and sensory experiences and offers a special way of understanding and responding to the world.


We link with local artists including illustrators and caricaturists.
